2019 National Senior Certificate Results

I am delighted to present to you a summary of our 2019 IEB matric results. As a school community, we congratulate and celebrate the Class of 2019 as well as all our teachers on these excellent results.

All 88 of our girls passed and collectively achieved a 99% Bachelor Degree certification rate which will entitle them to apply for a Bachelor Degree course at a South African university. The IEB as a whole achieved a pass rate of 98,82% with a 89,5% Bachelor Degree certification achievement.

Our 88 candidates produced a total of 309 individual subject distinctions which equates to an average of 3,51 distinctions per pupil. This is the highest average number of distinctions achieved in recent years.

Notable achievements:

- **Maya Fleischer**, our 2019 Dux, was included in the IEB list of candidates for Outstanding Achievement (*ranked within the top 5% in 6 or more Subjects and achieving a rating level of 7 in Life Orientation*)
- 12 girls achieved distinctions in all 7 of their subjects
- 12 girls achieved distinctions in 6 of their subjects
- 34 girls achieved an average of 80% or more
- 17 girls achieved an average of 85% or more
- The 2019 cohort achieved a total of 23 individual results in **the top 1% of candidates per subject**, these include two achievements for AP English and AP Mathematics.
